## About the College

Named one of Kaplan's "25 cutting-edge schools with an eye toward the future," the Savannah College of Art and Design offers an innovative curriculum designed to provide an excellent arts education and effective career preparation for students. With three locations as well as online programs, the college attracts students from all 50 states and from more than 90 countries.

SCAD exists to prepare talented students for professional careers, emphasizing learning through individual attention in a positively oriented university environment. The goal of the college is to nurture and cultivate the unique qualities of each student through an interesting curriculum, in an inspiring environment, under the leadership of involved professors. SCAD features locations in Atlanta and Savannah, Ga., and in Lacoste, France, and also offers undergraduate and graduate degree programs online through SCAD-eLearning.

SCAD is a private, nonprofit institution accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and

Schools (1866 Southern Lane, Decatur, GA 30033-4097; telephone number 404.679.4501) to award bachelor's and master's degrees. The college offers Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Master of Architecture, Master of Arts, Master of Arts in Teaching, Master of Fine Arts, and Master of Urban Design degrees, as well as undergraduate and graduate certificates. The five-year professional M.Arch. degree is accredited by the National Architectural Accrediting Board.

Class size is small, allowing each student the opportunity to receive individual attention. Faculty members have distinguished backgrounds in their fields. An English as a Second Language program and dedicated international student services staff are available to assist international students with the adjustment to college life in the United States.

## About SCAD-Lacoste

SCAD-Lacoste is located in Provence, in the South of France. Formerly the Lacoste School of the Arts, founded by American painter Bernard Pfriem in 1970, SCAD-Lacoste offers a unique opportunity for students and faculty to spend an entire term immersed in the culture of the region.

Full degree programs are not offered at SCAD-Lacoste. Courses vary each term and may be offered in painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, film and television, photography, digital imaging, historic preservation, performing arts, art history, architecture, liberal arts, French language and culture, and other topics. Classes are taught in English.

Lacoste is a beautifully preserved medieval village and vibrant art community of about 300 inhabitants. Here, one can wander among the mazelike ruelles and join with others in artistic endeavors.

Extraordinary light and beauty in an exquisite rural setting form the backdrop for a focused educational experience.

SCAD-Lacoste facilities date back to the 15th and 16th centuries. Within these ancient walls, SCAD-Lacoste offers a variety of modern amenities, including computer labs with Internet and e-mail access. Well-equipped teaching studios are dedicated to painting, drawing, sculpture, printmaking, photography, and digital imaging. Individual and group studios are available. Other facilities include a library, dining hall and housing for students, faculty and guests. Students may enjoy two cafés, a restaurant and a boulangerie in the village.

The graduate residency program at SCAD-Lacoste provides a unique forum for self-directed study and artistic engagement. Designed to support and encourage graduate-level students, the program is committed to the production of high-quality work and thought-provoking discourse within a small, nurturing community. Participants work independently in studios, convene regularly with resident faculty and meet with distinguished visiting artists. Group critiques, lectures and regional excursions further enhance the experience.

Activities outside the classroom include faculty lectures, workshops and exhibitions, as well as visits to artist ateliers, museums and historic sites in the area. At the end of each quarter, students have an opportunity to exhibit their work at a local vernissage.

In the mild spring, summer and autumn seasons, opportunities abound for outdoor recreational activities such as hiking, biking and swimming. The ease of village life at Lacoste is balanced by frequent excursions to the nearby cultural centers of Avignon, Aix, Arles and Marseilles, as well as trips to larger cities such as Paris.
